

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy presents its compliments to the Embassy of Libya and has the honour to inform them of the following:

Because the possession of a passport is generally accepted to be adequate evidence of the passport holder's nationality and because the British Government has no objection to the travel of private citizens outside the United Kingdom, the Embassy will no longer provide additional documentation or statements to private citizens stating that the Embassy has no objection to their travel.

The British Embassy will continue to provide diplomatic notes to travellers on official missions on behalf of the British Government.

The Embassy normally imposes no requirement on private citizens of other countries to provide diplomatic notes or other statements from their Embassies to accompany a visa application.

The Embassy hopes that, on a reciprocal basis, your Embassy will extend this same courtesy to British nationals and to nationals of those countries whose consular interests the Embassy represent.

Her Britannic Majesty's Embassy avails itself of this opportunity to renew to the Embassy of Libya the assurance of its highest consideration.
